- ↔ Speaking of speed, the limit is 20 mph on the roads, this is for ALL vehicles (personal vehicles too) It is 10 mph on the road behind the campers
- ↔ Driving on the grass is prohibited. There is a paths starting in the grassy area in front of the permanent campground and each path is leading directly to a specific camper.

Conservation Committee

June 2017

The conservation committee has been meeting to consider the recommendations resulting from the lake survey taken in April. One of the items was the over population of carp in the lake. There was consideration for producing a one day carp fishing tournament complete with prize awards. We also learned that a commercial fisherman would be willing to net out carp this fall. After some discussion the committee has decided to recommend allowing the commercial fisherman to fish the lake for carp only this fall.

The second item the committee has address is the recommended need for fish habitat to be introduced into the lake in order to provide some type of cover for both smaller fish and spawning. Plans are for an initial habitat build using wood pallets for Friday June 23rd at 9:00 AM meeting at the maintenance building. Anyone is welcome to come help build or donate wood pallets. Sheet Pan Shrimp Boil

Yield: 6 servings, Prep Time: 10 minutes, Cook Time: 30 minutes, Total Time: 40 minutes

Easiest shrimp boil ever! And it's mess-free using a single sheet pan. That's right. ONE PAN. No newspapers. No bags. No clean-up!

Ingredients:

- 1 pound baby Dutch yellow potatoes
- 3 ears corn, each cut crosswise into 6 pieces
- 1/4 cup unsalted butter, melted
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 tablespoon Old Bay Seasoning
- 1 pound medium shrimp, peeled and deveined
- 1 (12.8-ounce) package smoked andouille sausage, thinly sliced
- 1 lemon, cut into wedges
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley leaves



Directions:

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F. Lightly oil a baking sheet or coat with nonstick spray.

In a large pot of boiling salted water, cook potatoes until just tender and parboiled, about 10-13 minutes. Stir in corn during the last 5 minutes of cooking time; drain well.

In a small bowl, combine butter, garlic and Old Bay Seasoning.

Place potatoes, corn, shrimp and sausage in a single layer onto the prepared baking sheet. Stir in butter mixture and gently toss to combine.

Place into oven and bake for 12-15 minutes, or until the shrimp are opaque and corn is tender.

Serve immediately with lemon wedges, garnished with parsley, if desired.
